

Trail Lengths

Please Note: Woods roads and firebreaks on the property are not marked trails.

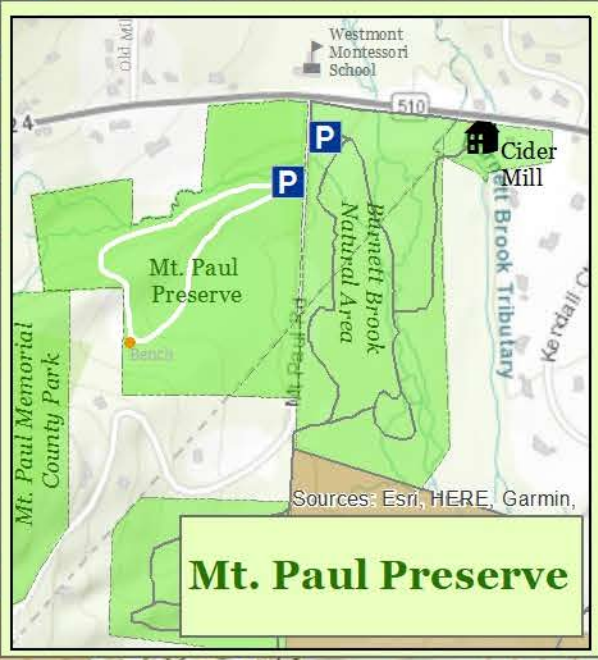
- Red: Nature Center - Elevation 711' - North Gate Rd. - Roxiticus Rd. 1.5 mi.
- Blue: Loop from Nature Center - Lookout point - N. Branch Raritan River - Schiff driveway. 2.4 mi.
- Green: Red - White/Black. 0.5 mi.
- Light Green (one way): Trailhead on Mosle Rd. - South to river edge - Pasture - End N. Branch Raritan River. 1 mi.
- Yellow: Roxiticus Road - White/Black trail. 1.0 mi.
- Purple: Red - Green trail 1 mi. Spur to Union Schoolhouse Rd. 0.5 mi.
- Lavender: Loop from Amphitheatre - Wood Badge Lodge. 0.8 mi.
- Orange: White/Black Trail Cut-off. 0.7 mi.
- White/Black: Pleasant Valley Road Trailhead - Roxiticus Rd. 2.18 mi.
- White/Black Spur: White/Black trail - Thomas Rd. 0.5 mi.
- White: Loop around Great Meadow from Nature Center. 0.9 mi.
- Mt. Paul Light Blue: Loop to Look Out around wetlands. 0.75 mi.

Visitor Use Policy

- Open for passive recreational use from dawn to dusk.
1. Motorized vehicles are allowed on the main entrance/exit road and in the parking area ONLY.
 2. Deer management hunting is permitted by authorized hunters ONLY.
 3. Fishing, trapping, or firearm use by others is prohibited.
 4. Alcoholic beverages or smoking on the preserve is prohibited.
 5. Removal, destruction, or disturbance of plants, wildlife, or soils is prohibited. Please leave no trace.
 6. Littering of trash or pet waste is prohibited. Please carry out all waste.
 7. Swimming in any body of water on the preserve is prohibited.
 8. Paint ball or bb gun use on the preserve is prohibited.
 9. Dog walkers must stay on trail and keep pets on leash at all times.
 10. Overnight use or campfires are permitted by advance request and permit ONLY.
 11. Signs restricting area use are to be adhered to.
 12. Hikers must stay on existing roads and trails AT ALL TIMES to prevent injury and erosion.
 13. Mountain bikers and horseback riders must keep to designated trails.
